Coll. The stories and images stem from a mixture of truths, dreams and lies. These ramblings are now being compiled into a book,


NOTES FROM THE BONEYARD, which will be released through Sideshow Hustle Press.



His work reflects his passion for the Post Impressionists, in particularly the Camden Town Group. He paints with a limited palette of only three hues and white to achieve his distinctive images. 


When 10 tickets or more are purchased for a show, a 10% discount off the full price can be obtained. For designated evening performances educational groups can obtain a 20% group discount.




